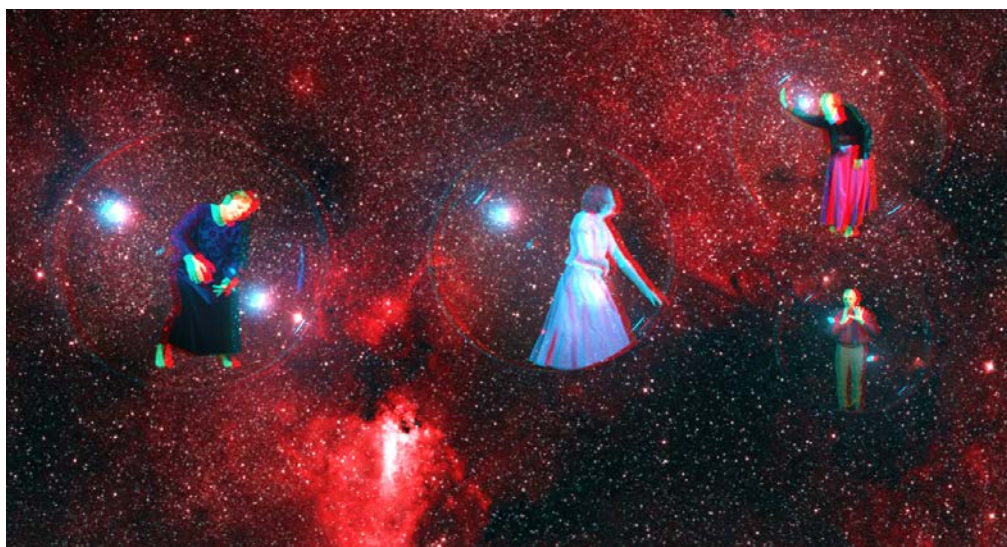

Converting XYZ to Anaglyph

Another Language Performing Arts Company is currently converting the 3D video portion of *XYZ* from active 3D stereoscopy to red/cyan anaglyph stereoscopy. This conversion will make the 3D *XYZ* experience available to more viewers with the use of widely available red/cyan glasses. This will allow the company to stream *XYZ* from the website or provide screenings at many other venues.

The conversion process involves, re-rendering all the animation for the 12-minute video, because the interaxial separation (the distance between the right and left virtual cameras) needs to be reset, placing the cameras much closer together.

Since another pass through the render process is required, it will be necessary to re-edit the final stereographic scenes together. Once this is complete, the left and right videos will be processed in Adobe After Effects in order to produce the final red/cyan anaglyph video. The resulting video can then be screened on any standard HD TV or video display.

Another Language will continue to research the stereographic video process to find the best methods that will present the Company's 3D work in the highest quality. The next showing of *XYZ* will be for *12 Minutes Max* produced by *Dunce School for the Arts* on June 23rd at 2pm.

Audience members will wear the “really cool” red and cyan paper glasses. These glasses will be a take home gift for attendees.

Dunce School for the Arts is a broadband art house founded by Gretchen Reynolds and Alexandra Karl. It is located in Sugar House (Utah) at the Rockwood Studios, #5 1064 E, 2100 S. *12 Minutes Max* showcases short experimental pieces and works-in-progress across disciplines with a twelve minute maximum performance time. It takes place on the third Sunday, every other month. Admission is FREE with concessions available and donations are gratefully accepted. Everyone is welcome but please no children under 10.

DUNCE believes everyone has something unique and interesting to say. Offering a wide range of classes and workshops for adults, they help students distill an artistic vision and develop their own visual language. Classes blend time-honored traditions with contemporary practices.

VOLUMETRIC SOCIETY OF NYC – 3D, TELEMATICS, KINECT, EMOTIV +



Ellen Pearlman – Co-Organizer, Director and Curator of the Volumetric Society of New York City contacted Another Language Directors Elizabeth and Jimmy Miklavcic, after hearing about the *XYZ* (2013) stereoscopic project through a blog post on the Dance-Tech.net (<http://www.dance-tech.net>) DTTV Social Network founded by Marlon Barrios Solano. The Volumetric Society of NYC (<http://volumetric.org>), is organized by Ellen Pearlman and Sean Kean.

Comprised of an eclectic group of almost one thousand New York City based innovators, they explore the art and science of the new world of natural user interface (NUI) between body, brain, and spatially aware computing for the physical world. The Volumetric Society has on going meet ups in various locations throughout New York to exchange ideas, demo projects, and expose members to the volumetric future through devices such as Kinect, Emotiv/MindWave, volumetric 3D displays, cameras and telematic interfaces. Everyone is welcome – from advanced hardware hackers to those who would like to learn what can be done with these new technologies in the arts, sciences, health-care, gaming, academia, and business venture opportunities.

The Volumetric Society also offers low cost classes in high-end technology partnering with Devotion Gallery in Williamsburg, Brooklyn, [<http://learn.areyoudevoted.com/>] and the IMC Labs in Chelsea, Manhattan [<http://www.theimclab.com/>]. In the coming month they will be offering members a social networking platform through TenLegs (<https://www.tenlegs.com/>), and a Kinect Lab for collaborations through CultureHub/LaMaMa Seoul Arts.

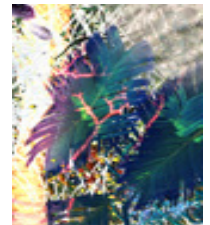
