### InterPlay: Hallucinations

#### ACM SIGGRAPH 2004

On August 11, I went to Los Angeles to attend the ACM Special Interest Group in Computer Graphics (SIGGRAPH) 2004 Conference. There, with Miho



Aoki (University of Alaska, Fairbanks), we met with Donna Cox (National Center for Supercomputing Applications, NCSA) the chairperson of SIGGRAPH's Emerging Technologies Exhibition and Linda Lauro-Lazin (Pratt Institute) the chairperson of SIGGRAPH's Art Gallery. We gave a brief introduction of the Access Grid and the newly formed Art on the Grid consortium. I then previewed a portion of the DVD InterPlay: Hallucinations. This DVD is the edited version of the InterPlay: Hallucinations originally performed April 23 – 25.

#### SYMPOSIUM ON ARTS & TECHNOLOGY 2004

We continued spreading the word about Another Language's innovative projects at the Symposium on Arts & Technology. It was held at the University of Utah's Art & Architecture New Media Wing on September 30 – October 2. We were selected to present a poster session, so armed with a four foot by eight foot poster and a

laptop to play the InterPlay: Hallucinations DVD, we spoke with many of the attendees and found several people that were very interested in our work.

#### SUPERCOMPUTING GLOBAL 2004

On Thursday, November 11, at the SC Global 2004 Conference in Pittsburgh, PA, I presented a paper authored by Beth Miklavcic and myself titled InterPlay: Hallucinations, a Telematic Performance Form Case Study. This was the first time that we were able to show others associated with the Access Grid how grid communications can be used for artistic pursuits. We also had the great opportunity





to meet with many of the people with whom we have been collaborating. The evening prior, many members of the Art on the Grid consortium met once again with Donna Cox and Linda Lauro-Lazin of SIGGRAPH 2005 and presented an informal outline of a performance at the conference in July. We're hopeful that Another Language will perform in Los Angeles at SIGGRAPH 2005 conference.


