in Seattle for the annual *International*Supercomputing Conference held at
the Washington State Convention and
Trade Center on November 12-18, 2005.
Supercomputing is a conference that focuses
on the innovations and research of high
performance computing throughout the world.

Supercomputing Global is a program within the Supercomputing Conference that

focuses on the developments of new applications that utilize the *Access Grid* technology. "SC Global 05 will reflect and demonstrate a range of human interactions spanning the spectrum of distributed



artistic through scientific interactions. As in past *SC Global* programs, the Seattle conference site will be linked to sites and presenters around the world." <sup>1</sup>

We performed this season's *InterPlay: Loose Minds in a Box* on Thursday, November 17 at 11:15 am PST. This session received the most attendance, with fifty people in the audience and thirty-eight remote sites from around the world viewing this ground breaking collaborative work.
